EMERGENCIES IN THE PARK

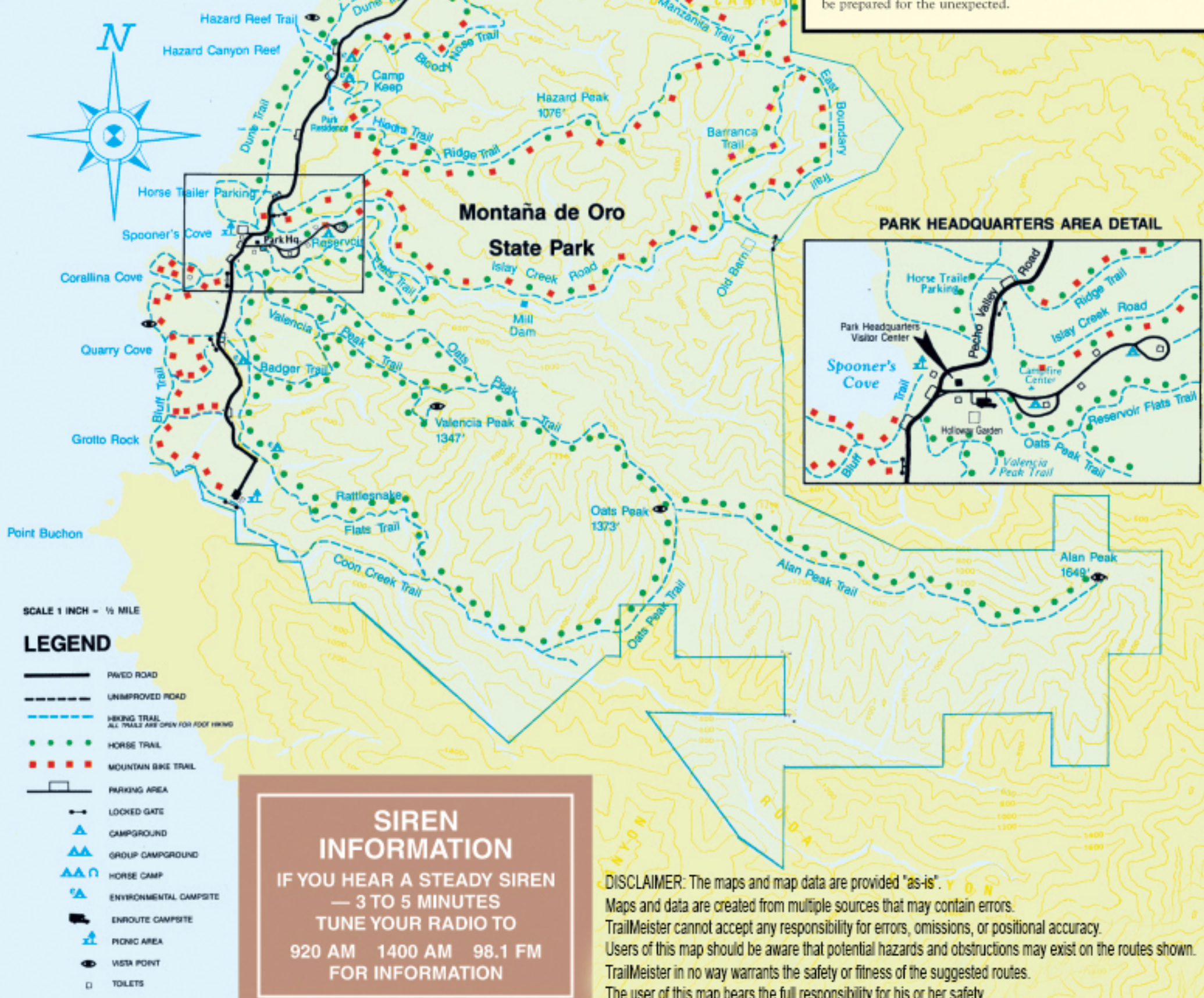
Emergency situations occur in the park from time to time. If you encounter one, immediately notify park personnel of its nature and location. If you cannot find park personnel quickly, call 9-1-1 and give the information to the emergency dispatcher. There are telephones at the Visitor Center and Sand Spit Day Use area.

Other community-threatening emergencies, such as a hazardous materials spill, tsunami (tidal wave), fire or an emergency at the Diablo Canyon Power Plant, may cause early warning system sirens to emit a steady sound for three to five minutes. Those sirens can be heard throughout the park. If you hear the siren while visiting the park, return to your car immediately. Tune your radio to 920 or 1400 AM or 98.1 FM for more information. If action is required, you will be told what to do.

Park personnel may also notify you of an emergency through a public address system or by visiting camping areas. Helicopters may be used to alert hikers in the back country. If you are asked to leave the park or take some other action, do so safely and as quickly as possible.

You may see siren information signs throughout the park. They are reminders of radio stations to tune to for information.

No one expects an emergency to arise – but it's smart to be prepared for the unexpected.
