Reserve early! Reserve campsites, yurts and our meeting hall two days to nine months in advance by phone: Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687). Campsites and yurts also are reservable through www.oregonstateparks.org.

Nehalem Bay State Park lies on a sand spit with two inviting sides—a picturesque, recreation-rich bay on one side and a long, sandy ocean beach with scenic Neahkahnie Mountain in the background on the other.

Universal Access

3 campsites (A13, A30, A44) and all 18 yurts are accessible to campers with disabilities.

Discovery Season

From October 1–April 30, you can rent a full, electric or tent site for less. At most state parks, including Nehalem Bay, you can save \$4 off summer rates. Yurt rates are the same all year.

Yurts!

Enjoy the year-round comforts of a domed tent with structural support, a wood floor, lockable wooden door, lights, heating and beds with mattresses. A bunk bed sleeps three, and a foldout couch sleeps two. A fire ring, picnic table and paved parking are right outside.

Horses Welcome

The reservable horse camp has 17 campsites, each with two corrals, a fire ring and picnic table. Water is available in the camp. Each site accommodates two horses comfortably. Trails and beaches offer more than 20 miles of riding experiences. You will find a public horse training/warm-up corral and seasonal horse rentals in the main day-use area.

Bring a Group

Our year-round meeting hall accommodates 50 people and is available for all types of gatherings, including family reunions and club meetings. Reservations are required year-round.

Enjoy Bay and Beach

You have the best of two worlds at Nehalem Bay State Park. A boat ramp provides access to fishing and crabbing on the bay. A two-mile bicycle trail winds along the bay shore and a unique dune environment.

Sheltering dunes separate the campground from the ocean beach, which extends the length of the four-mile spit. Beachcombing can produce special rewards—treasures that include agates, occasional glass floats and chunks of beeswax off 16th century Spanish merchant ships. Horseback riders enjoy both the beach and the trail to the end of the spit. A horse concession operates in our day-use area during the summer.

You have two picnic areas to choose from. One overlooks the bay near the boat launch area with green, coastal mountains framing the background. Another is closer to the ocean and has a trail leading from the area over the dune to the beach. Both areas have picnic tables, fire rings and modern restrooms. Watch for deer, elk and other wildlife along a two-mile gravel trail leading from the end of the day-use area to the Nehalem River's north jetty.

Have Fun Learning

Daily interpretive programs occur from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Junior Ranger activities for youngsters (ages 6-12) are offered every morning. Visitors of all ages are welcomed at our amphitheater for evening presentations.

Ask about the guided tidepool walks and interpretive hikes offered here and at nearby parks. Look for schedules posted at our amphitheater, registration booth and information kiosks.

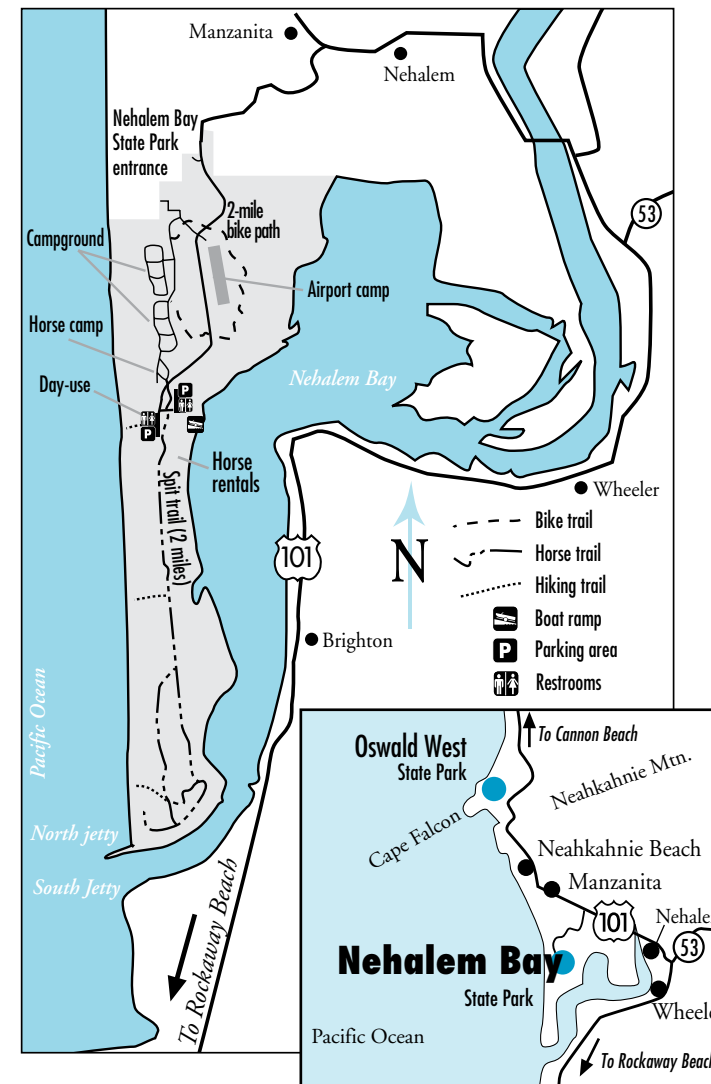
Recycle Now for the Future

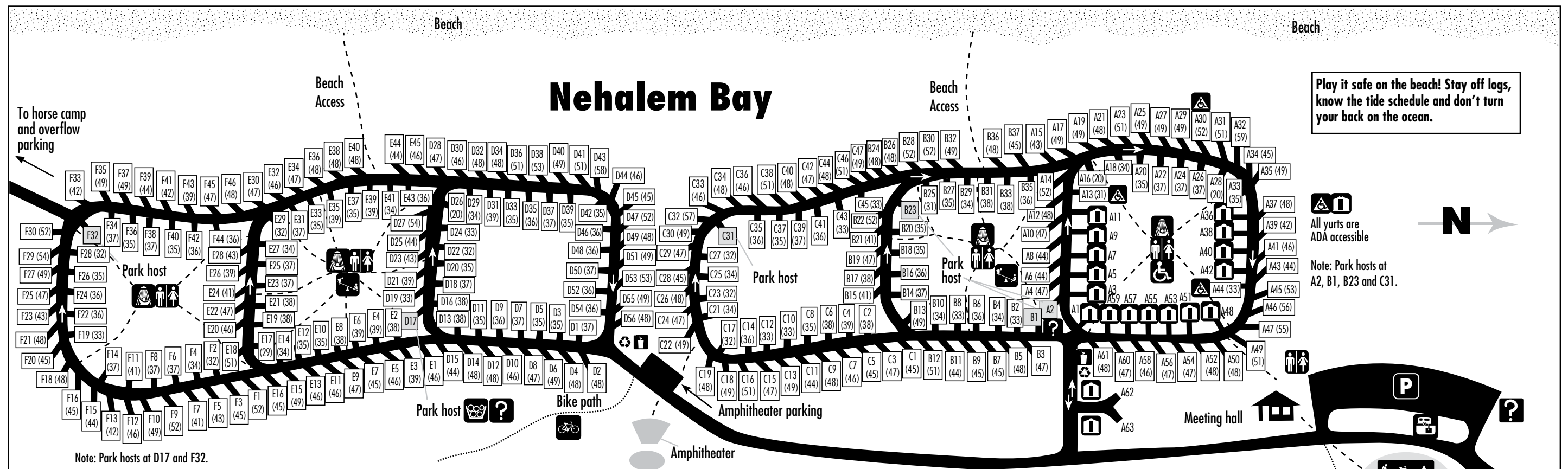

Day-Use Area Fees

Nehalem Bay requires a day-use permit year-round. Display a daily permit, a 12- or 24-month permit, Oregon Coast Passport or your camping receipt. Your camping receipt, which is equal to a daily permit for those days registered, should be displayed on the driver side of your dashboard. You may purchase a daily permit at the pay station in the day-use area. The 12- and 24-month passes are sold at major state park offices.

Play it safe on the beach! Stay off logs, know the tide schedule and don't turn your back on the ocean.

All yurts are ADA accessible

Note: Park hosts at A2, B1, B23 and C31.

Note: Park hosts at D17 and F32.

Please help make camping here a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only. You may park a second vehicle at your site (for an extra vehicle fee), but any other vehicles must be registered and parked in overflow parking areas near the meeting hall, amphitheater, horse camp entrance or next to sites A33, B22, F8, F44 and D42.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed. (See our "Pets in Parks" brochure for details.)
- Collecting firewood is prohibited. You may buy firewood at the park.

Check-in after 4 p.m., Check-out by 1 p.m.

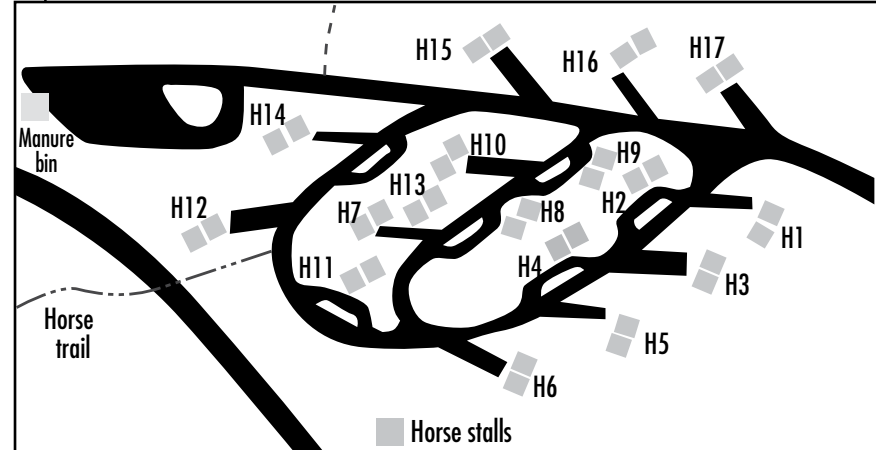

Horse Camp

All campground rules in addition to the following, apply to the horse camp.

- Maximum four horses per site.
- Ride on designated trails and only on the beach west of the foredune. Horses are permitted on the entire beach.
- Stalls must be cleaned before departure.
- Fires permitted only in fire rings.
- Temporary corrals are not permitted.

Note: Please keep horses in designated areas.
